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Medical Research Studies

Medical research studies follow a detailed study plan called a protocol. The protocol is reviewed and approved by an independent review board (IRB) comprised of doctors, scientists, and community members not affiliated with the company sponsoring the research. The IRB's job is to help ensure that the study is well designed and includes safety precautions to protect all study participants. Participation in this study could help researchers learn more about hand and wrist surgeries after mastectomies.

However, your participation is completely voluntary. You may stop participation at any time. In addition, the research staff is required to provide you with complete answers to any questions you may have.

Lend a Hand to Research

Women who have had a mastectomy are often advised to avoid any procedure such as blood pressure measurements and lab work on the hand/wrist of their respective surgery.
